Together with a comprehensive feature set and low power consumption, the ATmega169 takes on many of a butterfly's qualities, such as Beauty and High Efficiency at a very low energy consumption. 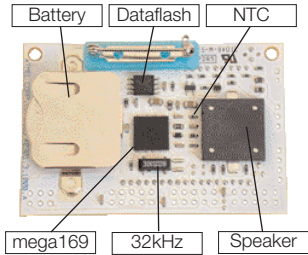
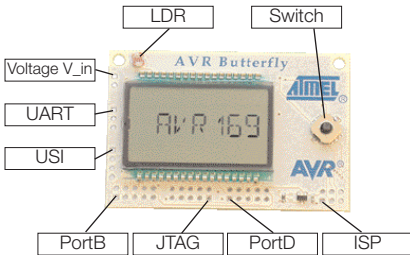

Getting Started

The AVR Butterfly is in power save mode, by pressing the joystick UP you will wake it up and it is immediately ready for use.

The AVR Butterfly contains a number of applications available from a menu system. Start these applications by using the 4-way joystick to navigate to the correct application, and pressing the joystick down. (click) to select.

Board Description, Front side:

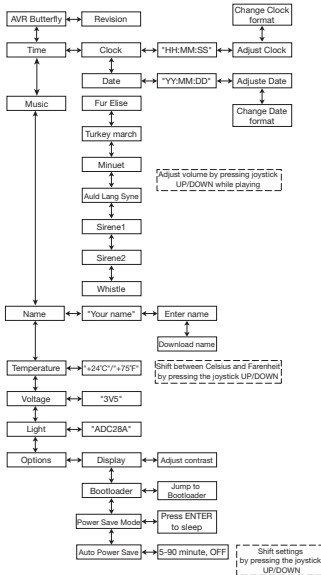


Developing Your Own Applications

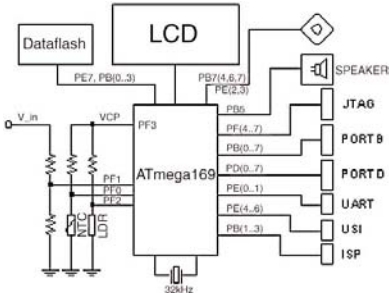
